I./- Goal

The Lao Children with Disabilities has to Equality full Accessible in the Lao society.

II./- Objective

1. To support the assistive devise to the children with disabilities who is living in the Lao society;

III./- Rationales for project

The 2015 National Housing and Population Census identified around 176,857 persons with disabilities (1.4% of the population) increasing from 56,727 persons in the 2005 Population Census. A study of girls' education in Lao PDR found that having a disability lowered a child's probability of attending school by 13 percent. It was also found that ethnicity is a complicating factor with rural Lao-Tai girls being significantly disadvantaged in comparison with other sub -groups. This demonstrates how two factors of marginalization (gender and ethnicity) intersect to further marginalize select groups of girls and the importance of taking a holistic approach to inclusive education. This need has been recognized by the government and positive steps are now being taken in Lao PDR to promote Inclusive education.

The educational attainment of persons with disabilities was alarmingly low: 41 percent of persons with disabilities aged 6 and above were illiterate. Those with an educational attainment of lower secondary level or higher accounted for only 19.5 percent of persons with disabilities. Regarding technical and higher education, 93.4 percent of persons with disabilities aged 16 or above received none. Lack of appropriate teacher training, skills and confidence are identified as significant barriers to education for children with disabilities. Regarding social status, 70 to 80 percent of persons with disabilities residing in urban areas and 65 to 70 percent of the persons with disabilities in rural areas were dependent on support provided by their families (mainly), and social assistance from government and local communities. Only 25 to 35 percent of persons with disabilities had any involvement in paid employment. There are several problems with this current system of provision, not least of which is the fact that special schools and residential hostels are not able to accommodate the large numbers of out-of-school disabled children. Furthermore, special schools tend to be unregulated and underfunded, resulting in poor quality teaching and scarcity of materials. Similarly, non-formal education is commonly unregulated and may be of poor quality. In addition, non-formal education initiatives often expect a financial fee or contribution from children's' families.

ACDA is one of the few Lao Civil Society Organizations/Non Profit Associations who focus exclusively on Children with Disabilities' Human Rights in Lao PDR. ACDA considers the Human Rights are fundamental rights of people and essential in the promotion of sustainable development. With the implementation of the basic rights education for Lao Children with Disabilities who are learning at the 99 inclusive education schools in 6 districts in Vientiane Capital, 3 districts in Vientiane Province, 3 districts

in Oudomxay Province, 2 districts in Louangprabang province, 2 districts in Xiengkhouang Province, 1 district in Bolikhamxay Province, 2 districts in Savannakhet and 2 districts in Champasak Province.

The Aid Children with Disability Association (ACDA) will work closely with the Lao government, INGOs, NGOs/NPAs/CSOs, ASIA Regional and the International for the good cooperation to support Lao Children with Disabilities to have the opportunity the full rights of the rehabilitation and development to become the human resource to participate development in the Lao PDR.

IV./- The activities;

- (1). Open the ceremony the handover the 90 wheelchairs to ACDA and ACDA handover to Lao Children with Disabilities at Guest House Labour and Social Welfare in Vientiane Capital;
- (2). ACDA's team work bring the wheelchairs to Children with Disabilities who is living at the local area of Lao PDR;
- (8). ACDA's team work go to visit for monitoring and evaluation the parents of children with disabilities and children with disabilities who get the wheelchairs.

V./- Methodology

ACDA's team work as we have plans to open a handover ceremony wheel 90 important in a way that is completely unique as they interact with coordination committee of the National People with Disabilities, Ministry of Labor and Social Welfare, Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Ministry of Finance, Ministry Home Affair, Government involved, parents, parents of children with disabilities, including children with disabilities who would wheel and authorities of tourism to the ceremony exposed especially the guest INGOs JICA, Japan embassy, Japan INGO. The official also led the planning team of the Group to Send the Wheelchairs to Overseas Children visit and deliver a wheelchair to disabled children in the capital Vientiane.
